We're gearing up for a vibrant year filled with standout exhibitions, events, programs, and learning experiences—and we can't wait to share them with you. This annual program kicks off with a landmark exhibition: *The Wiyaan*.

This powerful exhibition invites visitors into the story of the Three Brothers, Ancestors of the Tweed Bundjalung, whose journeys shaped the languages and lore of this region. Curated by community and brought to life with animation specialists Ludo Studio, *The Wiyaan* blends digital brilliance with cultural knowledge to honour Elders and spark storytelling for generations to come.

From there, *Ritual* explores the traditions—ancient and everyday—that help us make sense of the world and stay connected. Featuring a mix of treasured collection pieces and contemporary works, it reimagines seasonal rhythms through themes of renewal, celebration, and community spirit.

Then *Birds* takes flight as a lively fusion of art, science, and playful discovery. With exquisite Gould illustrations, bold contemporary art, interactive family zones, and a peek into conservation and taxidermy practice, this exhibition reveals the Tweed's extraordinary birdlife and celebrates the people working hard to protect it.

Our 2026 program is also packed with opportunities to learn, play, and explore. Mini Museum Explorers returns every Friday during NSW school terms for ages 3+, offering dynamic weekly sessions filled with songs, stories, and hands-on activities that connect little learners with the world around them.

With support from Create NSW, the Museum on Wheels will hit the road once again—touring regional and remote


schools and historical societies with *Connected: From Signal to Stars*. This innovative project uses Collection objects, augmented reality, and digital technology to illuminate the history of communication and spark curiosity in classrooms across the region.

# THE WIYAAAN

## three brothers, one story




*The Wiyaan*, are an unbroken line of origin, the Ancestors of the Tweed Bundjalung.

The Three Brothers is a creation story that explains the origins of the Bundjalung Nation's different tribes and their dialects. It tells of three brothers who came across the sea in a canoe to settle in the region. In the southern dialect, their names are Mamoon, Birrung, and Yar-Birrain. In the northern dialect, they are known as Yarbiri, Marming, and Birin. After arriving with their families, they separated and headed north, west, and south, which led to their descendants forming distinct tribes and their languages evolving into different dialects. The story is a foundational part of Bundjalung culture and history, and its key locations marked by natural landmarks throughout the Northern Rivers.

Over the last several years the local Tweed Aboriginal community has created digital and material illustrations to ensure the perpetuation of the traditional stories of the Wiyaan and other lore. They were given to Elders and Knowledge holders to be a catalyst for transfer to younger generations.

*Ritual* explores the ways we find meaning and connection through shared traditions.

The exhibition brings together Museum collection objects and new acquisitions that reflect local traditions and contemporary expressions of faith and community. It celebrates the ways in which the Tweed community continue to find meaning through shared experience.

Drawing inspiration from the Labours of the Months (the medieval depictions of seasonal life), *Ritual* reimagines ancient cycles through the lens of the Tweed region and explores the interplay through the themes of light and darkness, water and renewal, harvest and celebration.

# BIRDS

Step into a world where feathers, form, and imagination take flight.

*Birds* is a unique crossover exhibition celebrating the beauty and complexity of avian life through the lenses of art and science. Explore the exquisite 19th-century illustrations of John and Elizabeth Gould, whose work bridged natural history and artistry. Encounter contemporary artists reinterpreting the avian theme in bold, unexpected ways.

Discover the fascinating craft of taxidermy, from delicate preservation techniques to the live beetle tank that reveals nature's own cleaning crew. For younger visitors, Mrs Gould's Playroom offers hands-on activities that spark curiosity and creativity. Interactive installations invite you to engage with birds beyond the frame — touch, listen, and imagine.

This exhibition also shines a spotlight on the Tweed Shire's own birdlife and the vital conservation efforts underway to protect these species and their habitats. Learn how local initiatives are working to ensure that the songs and colors of our native birds continue to thrive for generations to come.

# LAND LIFE CULTURE



Our permanent exhibition Land | Life | Culture tells the story of our part of the world from 360 million years ago to today.

The exhibition features important Indigenous cultural knowledge associated with key locations around the Tweed contributed by members of the local Aboriginal community as well as information on Tweed's biodiversity. There's something for everyone to discover, whether it be crystals, thunder eggs, volcanoes or snails!
